NEWS FROM SWEDEN

Umeå in northern Sweden was the place for the Swedish Convention 17-18 of March, 2007. March is supposed to show Umeå at its best with blue sky, white snow and glorious sunshine. Not so this year. Rainy, wet and muddy outdoors, the indoor climate was preferable. The host chapter Gamma had organised the meeting to its very best. Many excellent speakers from Umeå University performed and, added to that, food and entertainment were of high quality.

The convention was happy to be assisted by our European Director Trijny Schmitz du Moulin, Ulrike Gottlob, German State President and two teachers from Estonia, invited as observers. See special article.

At the Convention the Pedagogical Award of Sweden State was handed over to Inga Lundvall, Eta chapter.

Inga has developed the subject of textiles to become an aesthetical activity of excellence integrated into the cultural life of society. The work of her students is represented in theatre and opera performances, in the historical plays of the church and in exhibitions. She is strongly involved in the development of her students. Her work accords well with the criteria of the Prize and she is a worthy representative of her profession.
