Pulitzer-prize winner, Nicholas Kristof, *New York Times* columnist, gave the opening keynote address. "Achieving the Millennium Development Goals: Teaching for Action" served as the session's theme.

Best Practices awards for bringing the UN into the classroom were awarded to Texas members Connie Rensink and Kaylyn Hughes for their "Club We Can" project. Connie shared, "We accepted the CTAUN Best Practices Award on behalf of ourselves and two other colleagues for our 3rd-6th grade service group, Club We Can. Our North Euless Elementary students learn about Human Rights and how implement school, to community, and international

service projects. Students projects included a food drive, school flower bed maintenance. A drive for science lab materials and a fund raising project for children in Kenya. The school year culminated with an International Night. As a result, both academic achievement and school atmosphere improved over the course of the year. This school year has opened with a group of fifty students who have planned to take on one project a month." Three other awards were given to three New Jersey schools/districts: Hopewell Valley Central HS, Chestnut Ridge MS, and West Windsor-Plainsboro Regional School District.

The Educational Excellence Committee adopted a self-definition, which will be equally appropriate for state organization and chapter committees: "The Educational Excellence Committee promotes International projects, supports early-career educators, and encourages programs and activities that further educational excellence worldwide."
